

The influence of travel

In September, I traveled to Ireland for a week long class at Ballenglen Arts Workshop on abstracting landscapes, taught by Amy Metier. The beautiful rugged Atlantic coast of Ireland was an ideal place to explore what it meant to me to abstract natural beauty. As a result, I have begun a new series, of weavings from handpainted papers. These are more sculptural pieces than I've attempted previously and I'm enjoying the challenge of working in three dimensions. Below are two early pieces in this series.

As part of my time in Ireland, I also explored asemic writing. This style of communication eliminates the "...meaning itself, or rather the sign's capacity to convey meaning...so asemic writing is writing that does not attempt to communicate any message other than its own nature as writing." (from Asemic The Art of Writing by Peter Schwenger).

I find that as I do more and more pieces in the same style, there is an evolution leading to a more mature and balanced body of work, such as my Time series (see article below). The direction that asemic writing may take me, if anywhere at all, is still unclear. We can wait together to see what unfolds. Two of my initial studies are below.



My Time series and Chroma Connections

September was busy starting off with two shows over Labor Day weekend. The piece below won an Honorable Mention at Paint the Town, Kensington. Much appreciation to Montgomery Artist Association and Sumita Kim who served as the judge. Several pieces sold at both Paint the Town and the Glen Echo Labor Day show. Thanks to all who supported my endeavors by coming to the shows.

Next, was the launch of the Chroma Connections group show at Chesapeake Framing. This show has been extended to November 28. Chroma Connections is a group of 6 local women artists. You can see the show at Chesapeake Framing, 10507 Metropolitan Ave., Kensington MD - open Monday through Saturday 10 am to 6 pm.

Chroma Connections is the debut for my full Time series - a body of work based on methodically placed rectangles, each of which contains random, disparate elements. In this series, the viewer is invited to view each rectangle as a time interval that they define – a day, hour, year or... These deeply personal pieces speak to the random occurrences that happen in our lives making each day different from the previous one. Grounded in the concept that time is perceived differently at various points in our life, each of those rectangles represent a time interval containing a unique experience - a day full of trouble; a moment when the way we perceive the world shifts forever; a long slog through a project that doesn't seem to end. The viewer's mindset frames the way the pieces are perceived.

Moments in Fall, the picture below, is an example of one piece from my Time series.




moments in fall oil and wax 24"hx30"w
